GROUP RESPONSIBILITIES:

I.) PRESENTATION HANDOUT (15 Points):

- 5 = presentation outline "paints a clear picture" of the material being presented, complete, organized, easy to follow, and free of major spelling / grammar errors
4 = presentation outline "paints an okay picture" of the material being presented, material is somewhat organized and easy to follow, some spelling / grammar errors exist
3 = presentation outline gives a general idea of the material being presented, however, some key information is missing, spelling / grammar errors are present
2 = presentation outline is vague, unorganized, and hard to follow making it difficult for class participants to gain an understanding of the material being presented
1 = presentation outline is incomplete, unorganized, and hard to follow making it impossible for class participants to gain an understanding of the material being presented
0 = no presentation outline prepared to accompany material presented

5 x 3 = 15 Points

**II.) GROUP DYNAMICS / CLASS LEADERSHIP
(5 Points):**

- 5 = group is cohesive and well organized, individuals participate equally to accomplish tasks of assignment, feedback from all members is positive
3 = group is somewhat cohesive and organized, members of group have struggled to delineate and accomplish tasks equally, feedback from group members reflects this
0 = group is not at all cohesive or organized, participation is not equal, feedback from group members reflects this

III.) PRESENTATION CONTENT (15 Points):

- 5 = presentation "paints a clear picture" of the topic; is comprehensive, well organized, easy to follow; and the audio-visual material is integrated into the presentation and is effective
4 = presentation "paints an okay picture" of the topic; is complete and organized, relatively easy to follow; and audio-visual material is present

- 3 = presentation gives a general idea of the topic, however, some key information is missing, audio-visual material may or may not be present
 2 = presentation is vague, unorganized, and hard to follow making it difficult for class participants to gain an understanding of the topic being presented, no audio-visual material is used
 1 = presentation is incomplete, unorganized, and hard to follow making it impossible for class participants to gain an understanding of the topic being presented
 0 = presentation does not take place

4 x 3 = 12 Points

INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

I.) PREPAREDNESS (5 Points):

- 5 = speaker appears confident and well prepared, displays thorough knowledge of subject matter, displays interest in the subject matter by incorporating examples and soliciting feedback as appropriate, answers all relevant questions
 4 = speaker appears well prepared and articulates main points, displays confidence and knowledge by use of examples, opinions, and factual evidence, answers most of the relevant questions
 3 = speaker appears professional and presents main points with some examples of relevance, answers some of the relevant questions
 2 = speaker appears uninterested in topic, displays little subject knowledge, supplies general information on the topic
 1 = speaker appears uninterested in topic, is disorganized in presentation of material, and main points are not relayed to audience, unable to answer any questions
 0 = speaker does not speak

II.) DELIVERY OF MATERIAL (10 Points):

- 5 = speaker uses good body language, maintains eye contact with audience, keeps audience's interest, voice is clear and distinct with a pleasant tone and appropriate volume
 4 = speaker uses body language, maintains periodic eye contact with audience, is able to keep audience's interest for the majority of presentation, voice is usually clear and distinct with a pleasant tone and appropriate volume
 3 = speaker is professional, maintains minimal eye contact with audience, audience's interest in the presentation is neutral, voice is sometimes garbled or muffled
 2 = speaker uses poor body language and voice is consistently garbled or muffled
 1 = speaker uses poor body language, makes no eye contact with audience, voice is garbled, muffled, and of inappropriate tone and volume
 0 = speaker does not deliver material
